Step 2 Remove the enclosure from the camera.

[1] Remove the enclosure and cushion from the camera. [2] Remove the power cord plug (accessory) and the EXT I/O terminal plug (accessory) attached to the camera.

 Enclosure is fixed to the camera body by the installed auxiliary wire, so please do not remove it.



Using the side cable access hole

When installing the camera directly on the ceiling or wall with cables exposed, or when mounting the camera using the ceiling mount bracket WV-Q174B (option), cut out a portion of the enclosure to open a side cable access hole.

IMPORTANT:

• To prevent injuries and protect the cables, finish the side cable access hole with a file to avoid sharp edges.

• A part of the enclosure and the auxiliary wire is omitted in the illustrations after Step 3.



Step 5 Adjustment

[1] Turn on power for the camera.

[2] Loosen the PAN table fixing screw. Adjust the angle of the camera with the PAN table, TILT table, and Azimuth adjustment ring.

Horizontal (PAN) angle: -240° - +120° Vertical (TILT) angle : -30° - +85° Azimuth (YAW) angle : ±100°

• When mounting the camera on a ceiling, adjust the TILT angle so that the TOP mark above the lens always comes to the top side. • When mounting the camera on a wall, rotate the PAN table by 180° to the left and rotate the TILT table till the TOP mark above the lens always comes to the top side.

[3] Tighten the cross-head side of TILT table fixing screw (on one side) and the PAN table fixing screw, and fix the camera unit.

(Recommended tightening torque: 0.59 N·m {0.44 lbf·ft})

[4] Adjust the zoom and focus.

- (1) Adjust the viewing angle by pressing the WIDE or TELE buttons. ② Adjust the focus by pressing the AF
- (auto focus) button. ③ Adjust the screen size and focus by
- repeating steps (1) and (2). Readjust the angle of the camera with the PAN table, TILT table, and azimuth adjustment ring if necessary.

Note:

• When using the camera at a vertical position angle of 75° or more (a position where the camera lens is mearly horizontal), part of the image may appear to be overlapped due to influence from the dome cover. To prevent overlapping, decrease the vertical position angle or adjust the zoom ratio.

[5] Disconnect the MONITOR OUT

conversion plug (accessory). Attach the enclosure and secure it by using a bit (accessory) to tighten the enclosure fixing screws (2 places).

Attach the enclosure by aligning the Panasonic logo to the direction marker $(FRONT \square)$ on the camera. (Recommended tightening torque: 0.59 N·m {0.44 lbf·ft})

Note:

- Mount the enclosure to the camera body at a straight angle
- The light-blocking rubber ring may be stretched depending on the TILT angle This does not have effects on lightblocking performance.
- Push the wires from the camera unit into the camera body so that they do not come out from the internal wall of the camera body.

[4] When the administrator registration window is displayed, enter "User name", "Password" and "Retype password" by following the instructions displayed on the screen, and then click the [Set] button.

Please keep your user name and password in a safe place free from public view to ensure security. After completing the registration, the camera will automatically be re-connected and the authentication window will be displayed. Enter the registered user name and password.

[5] When live images from the camera are displayed, the network connection is complete.

Note:

For more information on the following content, refer to the Operating Instructions on the Panasonic support web site.

- Please set [Time & date] on the [Basic] screen of "Setup" before using the camera.
- It is impossible to display H.265 (or H.264) or MJPEG images, receive/transmit audio, display logs, and use full-screen display when the viewer software "Network Camera View 4S" is not installed on the PC.
- Depending on the environment of your PC, it may take time for images to be displayed. • At the time of purchase, the audio input and output connectors are set to "Off". If needed,
- change the setting on the "Audio" screen in "Setup". • Due to security enhancements in "IP Setting Software", "Network settings" cannot be changed when around 20 minutes have passed after turning on the power of the camera to be configured. (When the effective period is set to "20 min" in the "Easy IP Setup accommodate period".) However, settings can be changed after 20 minutes for cameras in the initial set mode.
- Defocus may be caused by the reinstalled enclosure. In this case, perform the auto focus function from the setup menu.
